A bagged lunch will be provided to all children (0-18 years) in the community requesting a meal, <u>FREE OF CHARGE</u>. Acceptance and participation requirements for the program are the same for all regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, gender or disability. There will be no discrimination in the course providing brown bag lunches at the following pick-up locations.

When arriving at your pick-up location:

- In keeping with the goal of providing meals while also taking appropriate safety measures, **Parents/Guardians may pick up meals for children without them being present.** Parents/Guardians are to share the school name where each child attends that they are requesting meals for, if the children are of school age.
- The limit is one lunch bag per child per day.
- All food will be taken off-site. Families will NOT enter or eat in the buildings.
- Families will be asked to open their trunk or window to receive the meals from a safe distance with NO contact. Individuals may walk or bike for pick-up as well. To avoid contact, bags will be placed on a table for individuals to pick-up.
- To ensure safety for everyone, staff will be wearing bright vests, gloves and masks.

The Program will begin Monday, June 14, 2021 and end Thursday, August 5, 2021. Brown Bag Lunches will be available from 12:00 – 1:00 PM at the following locations:
